



Signs Your Child may be Dyslexic

Pre- School and Early Years children

When your child is this young it is not easy to be sure about dyslexia because they are at such an early developmental stage. There are, however, signs that it is possible.

These signs of dyslexia include:

- Enjoys sharing stories but is reluctant to try reading.
- Finds it hard to remember the names of colours.
- Is slow to acquire new words and speak in sentences.
- Finds getting dressed difficult, not recalling the order to put things on.
- Has problems learning the order of the alphabet, months of the year and days of the week. May not understand last week, today and tomorrow.
- Doesn't recognize rhymes. Does not remember nursery rhymes.
- May not be good with rhythm, and is often unable to clap how many syllables are in a word.
- Is inconsistent. Some days they can do things and sometimes they can't.

Remember, none of these alone indicates that a child is dyslexic. It is more likely to be a combination.
