

## Expected prior knowledge

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## Is this course for me?

This course is aimed at adults working with students with dyslexia in a professional capacity. It is for you if

- you are a teacher and want to get better at differentiating for learners with dyslexia
- support in class and want to enable learners with dyslexia to acquire greater independence,
- work with pupils with dyslexia in small groups or 1:1

**You will need to be able to work with the same learner with dyslexia on a weekly basis throughout the spring term. In the second half this needs to be at least twice per week for twenty minutes each time.**

## Certification

The qualification will be awarded based on activities completed during the sessions and compiled into a portfolio of evidence.

## Content

You will learn how to make a short term plan for a learner with dyslexia, deliver its content, monitor progress, report outcomes and evaluate the result.

You will be taught how to

- prioritise learning objectives
- understand the language of professional assessment reports
- assess the suitability of available intervention programmes
- involve and empower your learner
- monitor progress in every session
- adjust and plan sessions in the light of your observations
- communicate intervention outcomes to your line manager, your pupils and parents
- make a new plan for your learner.
